Connors' Scales for Teachers and Parents 3rd Edition. The Connors-3 (Connors, 2008) Parent Rating Scale (Connors-3-P) is the most recent revision to a widely used behavior rating scale system. The Connors-3-P is designed similarly to the BASC-2 Achenbach systems in that it includes a number of clinically relevant domains for which normative scores are derived.

Connors' Teacher Rating Scales - Psychology Roots

The short forms of the Connors' Rating Scales-Revised (CRS-R) system are used for quick assessment of characteristics and behaviors that are indicative of Attention-Deficit/Hyperactivity Disorder. Prior to scoring the rating scales, parents, teachers and adolescents above the age of 12 are asked to give feedback on behaviors that are present.

The CBRS is composed of three rating scales: one completed by the teacher (204 items), one by the parent or caregiver (203 items), and one by the student being evaluated (179 items). The teacher and parent scales, written at a fourth-grade reading level, can be used to assess students 6 through 18 years of age.

Conners 3 - The Cognitive Centre

When T-scores are less than 60 it means your child is in the normal range, however when the scores are above 60, there is possibility of behavioural issues. There are different categories:

- T-scores above 60 indicate there may be an issue, ADHD.
- T-scores from 61 to 70 indicate issues are lightly unusual, or moderately severe.
